

There seems to be a lot of questions about the layout of the program so thought I'd write up a little info to maybe help with the confusion.

When you first go to the EP site you will come to the homepage it should say '*complete, all free curriculum*' across the top. If your child is in preschool, you will click on Getting Ready 1, toward the top of the column on the right side of the page. If your child is in kindergarten, you will click on Getting Ready 2.

The rest will start with the grade your child is in and click on that level on the right hand side of the page, First, Second, etc. That will take you to a page that will list the days with the activities in it. That is the first half of the day. This is the part that each grade level does on their own. When all children are done with that portion of the day, there are 4 links at the bottom of each day's list that you will click on that will take you to the second half of the day's work.

The confusing part. ☺ -

This is the part all grade levels can work on together. All of your children should click on the same year. They should be done in order, but you don't have to start with year 1. It's your choice based on what you want to study. Just remember there are different difficulty levels. Level L means the elementary level. Level M is the middle level; for this curriculum it is used by grade levels 5-8. When your child clicks on one of the year links, it will automatically take him to the right level and day. Your children will be studying the same things, or similar things, but they will use different resources and have different assignments.

It does not matter what year you start with as long as you go in order. If you start with year 2 for everyone, then next year you will choose year 3 for everyone. Then the next year choose year 4, then year 1. Then you would start over, but the children would be to the next level by then and have new assignments for those same topics.

Example: If you start a 2<sup>nd</sup> grader in year 3, then you will work in Year 3 level L, then 4L, then 1L. Then the child would be in 5<sup>th</sup> so he would then move up to year 2M then 3M then 4M then 1M.
